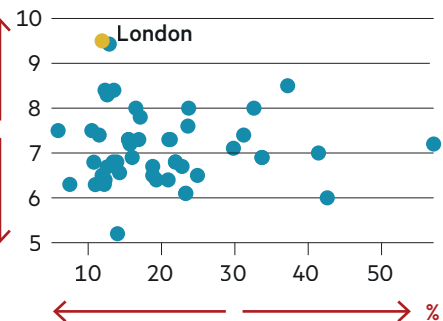


Growth and jobs

Contribution of High Growth Firms* (HGFs) to net job creation, by LEP** in England and by NUTS***2 region (Wales, Scotland, N. Ireland)

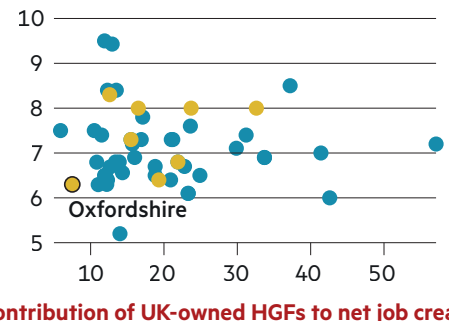
London

London has the highest proportion of HGFs, but their contribution to overall net job creation in the capital is relatively low



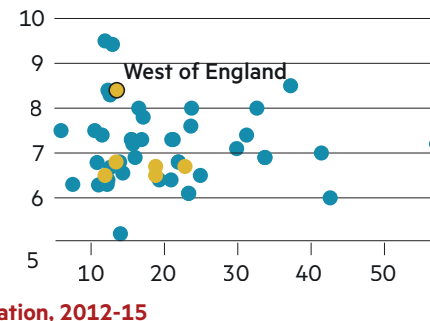
South East

Oxfordshire is one of the LEPs with the lowest proportion of HGFs and it contributes relatively little to net job creation



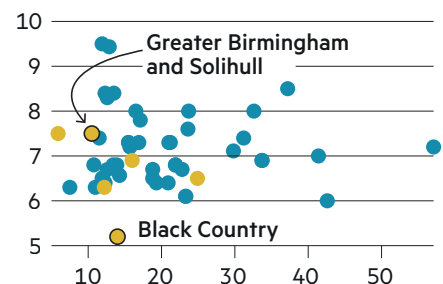
South West

HGFs provide a relatively low proportion of net new jobs, but West of England LEP outperforms the region



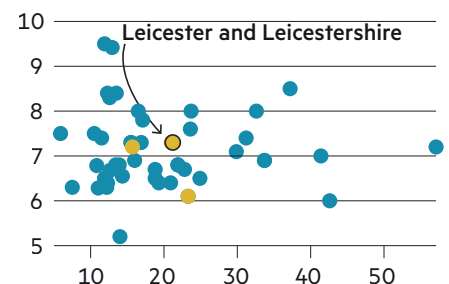
West Midlands

Black Country has the lowest proportion of HGFs across all LEPS



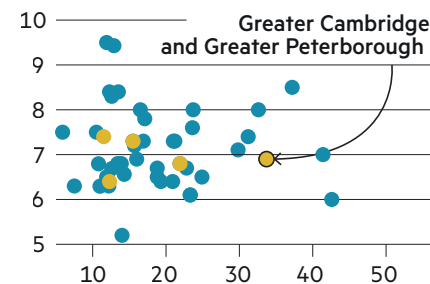
East Midlands

Leicester and Leicestershire LEP has a similar % of HGFs to Birmingham, but contributes twice as many net new jobs



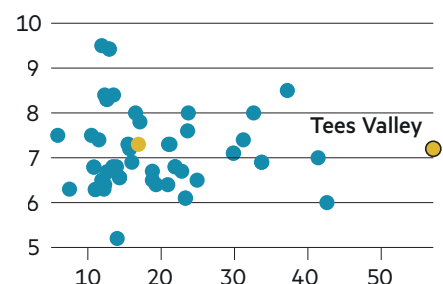
East of England

HGFs in Gr. Cambridge and Gr. Peterborough create the fifth-largest proportion of net new jobs in England



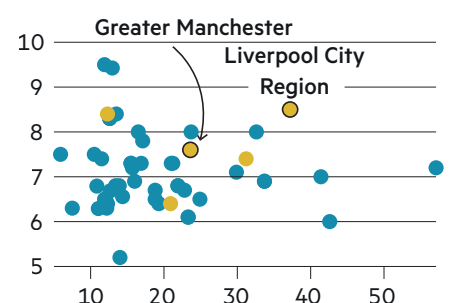
North East

HGFs in the Tees Valley have the highest contribution to the net job creation rate in England



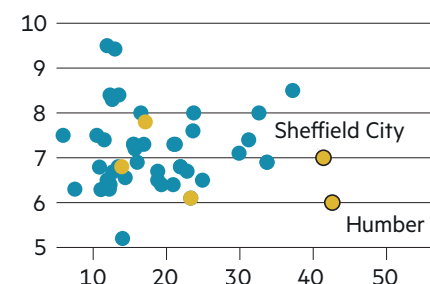
North West

Yorkshire and the Humber

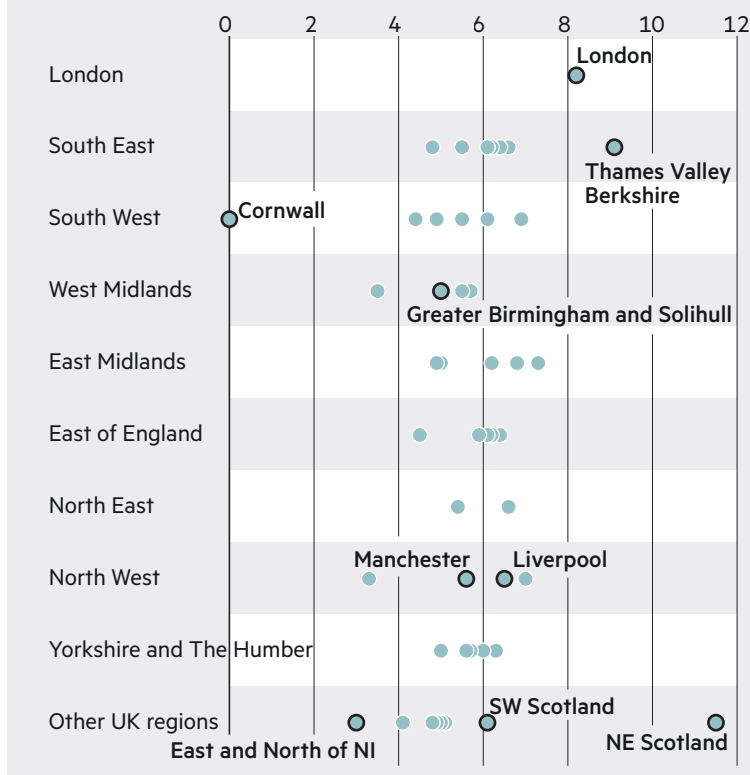
HGFs in Sheffield City and Humber contribute strongly to job growth, but there are relatively few of them

Outer Belfast has a low share of HGFs - 4.8% of those with 10 or more employees - but they contribute a large proportion of net new jobs
